Executive Summary:

In July 2026, the second full year of the Greenwood Entertainment District E-scooter Mobility Pilot program was completed. The pilot program was originally completed in July 2025, but extended for one year to allow for collection of additional data to determine whether a permanent program is warranted. Representatives from the Goldsmith Metropolitan District, Denver South, and SPIN will be in attendance to evaluate the results of the pilot program, answer questions, and discuss the potential options for a permanent e-scooter (and e-bike) program in Greenwood Village, in conjunction with other area jurisdictions.
