A motion was made by Arts Council member Stephanie Davis, seconded by Council member Patricia Aaron to approve minutes from the March 20 GVAHC Meeting. The motion was carried by unanimous voice vote.

4. PUBLIC COMMENT

No members of the public were present for this meeting.

5. NEW BUSINESS

A. Overview of Art Samples & Prices (2025-114)

Cultural Arts Manager Lisa Neeper presented multiple artworks of various sizes, materials, and price points to give the Arts Council members a general idea of appropriate budget considerations for a potential public art piece that the Council intends to install in Carson Park. It was noted that, in addition to the cost of the piece itself, the Council members should be mindful of ancillary costs such as engineering and safety, shipping and installation, possible construction costs associated with creating a pad/base for the sculpture to sit on, signage, lighting, and insurance and upkeep including ongoing maintenance and vandalism mitigation.

It was further discussed what the pros/cons might be for purchasing something prefabricated (as all the artworks presented were) versus putting out an open call for public art proposals, the latter offering the benefit of a one-of-a-kind piece designed specifically for this setting. Council members agreed that they would like more information about the history of Carson Park in order to shape the vision of what they're looking for before formally deciding on which process would best suit this project.

B. Budget Request for Carson Park Project (2025-115)

After reviewing the provided art samples and considering everything the budget must accommodate for this project, each Council member stated in turn a figure that they felt was appropriate to allocate. Each Council member explained their own reasoning, and the group discussed until a general consensus was reached. A motion was made by Arts Council member Ellie Moller, seconded by Council member Patricia Aaron to allocate a total budget of \$80,000 from the GVAHC reserve account for the Carson Park public art project. The motion was carried by unanimous voice vote.

6. STAFF UPDATES

A. Community Events Calendar (2025-116)

Cultural Arts Manager Lisa Neeper went over some upcoming events on the Community Events Calendar, noting in particular that Shakespeare in the Parking Lot was coming up on Saturday, May 3. Council members inquired about the status of the recent film screenings and upcoming Movie in the Park as well as Art on the Green, but out of consideration of time it was decided that these items would be included in New Business at the May 15 GVAHC Meeting.

B. Financial Summary Report (2025-117)

There being no further business to discuss, a motion was made by Arts Council member Ellie Moller, seconded by Council member Anne Cashman to adjourn the meeting. The motion was carried by unanimous voice vote. The meeting was adjourned at 7:15pm.

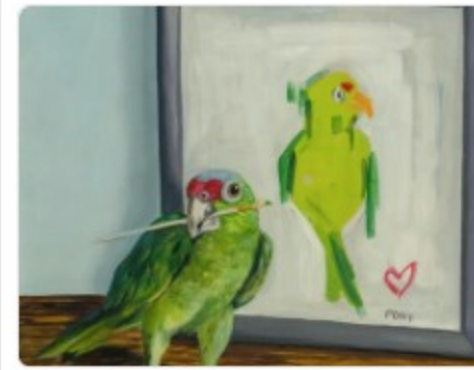
